

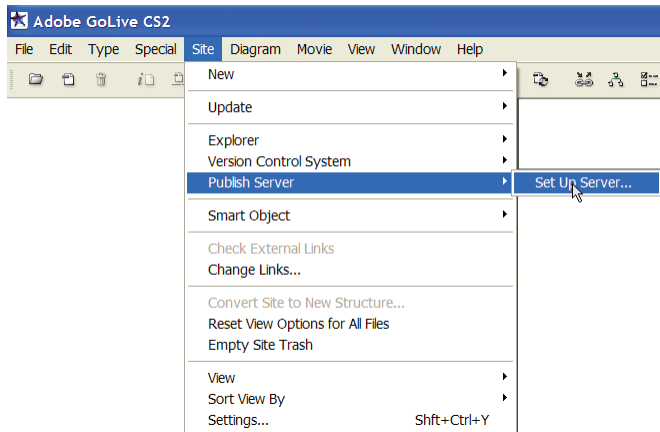
Upload your site

When you've designed all your pages, it's time to publish your site to a server. Before you can upload a site, you need a web server to host it. Contact your Internet Service Provider (ISP) or server administrator. One of these sources will be able to provide your site's IP address (a number similar to 217.123.12.4), the path to your folder or directory on the server, your user ID, and your password.

The Publish Server tab

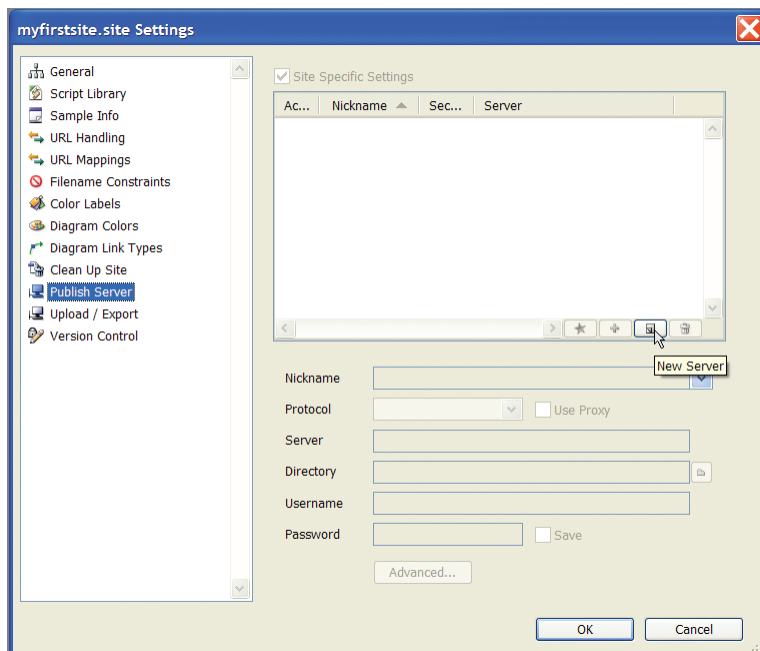
The Publish server tab lets you upload and manage your websites:

- 1 Choose Site > Publish Server > Set Up Server.



Select the Set Up Server option.

- 2 In the right side of the window, you'll see an empty box. Click the New Server icon at the bottom of this box.



Add a new server.

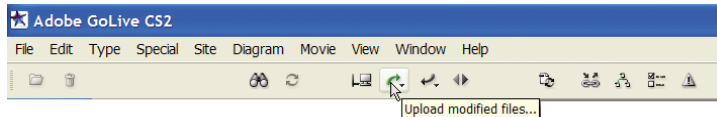
3 Name the server, enter the server information, and then click OK.

4 In order to connect to the web server, you need to connect to the Internet. Then click Connect To Publish Server in the GoLive toolbar. Notice that the Publish Server tab of the Site window is automatically selected upon connecting to the server, and that any files the server contains are displayed in a list.

5 To upload files, click the Upload Modified Files button next to the Connect To Publish Server button in the GoLive toolbar. Follow the on-screen instructions to upload your site.

Site maintenance

If you want to change something on your site, open the file from the GoLive Site window and work on it in the Layout window. When you're finished, make sure you're connected to the Internet and choose File > Save And Upload. Or, if you've updated multiple files, save them all first and then click the Upload Modified Files button. GoLive uploads only the parts of your site you change.
